- 7 Competencies of a midwife to be included in the training program of the Midwives.

- Every year there should be an appraisal with well-defined criteria (A 360 degree appraisal). We shall formulate the internal appraisal board.
- Midwives to participate in research along with the obstetrician and their involvement in the audit
- Midwives will remain under the cover of obstetrician for clinical risk management
- Only low risk mothers will be managed by the midwives independently
- Continuous Personal professional development will be expected of every midwife
- Curriculum should include knowledge about legislations in the country
- A Pilot study will be run pertaining to the training and outcome of the training.
- Medium of instruction will be English and Classes for Basic English language will be arranged.
- AGE CRITERIA for admission in midwifery program (a policy decision)
- Due recognition to be given to the Midwives in order to make a unique cadre for the midwives and give them a good remuneration (a policy issue)
- Minimum 18 months training followed by 6 months of intensive internship
- Introduce them as the PROFESSIONAL MIDWIFE cadre


## Other clauses agreed upon during the session were:

- Child birth education will be given by the midwives and physiotherapist together
- Plan for a handover involving the doctors and nurses together
- Concept of HEALTH VISITORS to be considered in our scenario to bridge need of continued health care and early diagnosis of postpartum depression in the post natal period ( a long term goal)

## Resolutions drawn through the brain-storming sessions were as follows:

## Care of new born in the postpartum unit :

- Obstetricians to take on 'Breast-Crawl' (Only for vigorous babies)
- Assessment of baby 'at breast'(Only for vigorous babies)
- A vigorous \& Healthy baby to be put to breast in the OT itself in cases of LSCS
- Quick review of breast feeding by the nurses as a routine activity, by a simple set of questions. Increasing involvement of the nurses.
- The nurses to be meticulous in documentation in order to identify all the reasons which make the mother walk up to the formula feed tin, work on them.
- Use of breast shield in cases of antenatal detection of retracted nipple
- Extraction of witch's milk prohibited in female newborns during bathing or cleaning the baby (to be included in Child birth Education module) -
- Stop giving post operative headlow, to avoid difficulty in feeding post CS
- Backrest | Privacy | soothing music - rooms dedicated to breast feeding
- Special dedicated nurse looking after breastfeeding
- Getting a Lactational consultant (IBCLC trained staff)
- Psychologists \& Counsellors noting down problems a mother has during breast feeding having BPNI training for them
- Come out with the data about incidence of hypoglycaemia in Cesarean delivered babies and vaginally delivered baby.
- Monthly joint meeting of the paediatricians and obstetricians\& nursing dept\& counsellors regarding policy makings \& problem solving


## Care of new born in the Nconatal Intensive Care Unit :

- Feeding sick babies in the NICU with breast milk (Colostrum)
- Use of Breast pumps in the NICUs


## Issues around adoption of Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative :

- Seriously adhere to the 10 commandments of BFHI, consider for evaluation for accreditation
- Plan for a milk storage units/ Milk management system ( to store extra breast milk for cases where mothers are not producing enough milk ) Long-term goals


## Contribution to the initiative through child-birth education classes and breastfeeding education:

- Show mothers' videos of normal bithing \& breast feeding as a part of antenatal classes
- Involve the grandmothers/mothers/mother in-laws ; as a support system to the mother (In child birth education classes)
- Pool in information from various departments regarding making modules in antenatal education
- Train the health care providers \& attendants working in the wards regarding breast feeding and generate awareness (during breast feeding week)
- Breast feeding support group: Mothers helping other mothers (Long term Goal)
- Education of the dais/baby masseurs in villages (in the adopted villages)


## Research avenues:

- Follow-up records of cases included in our pilot studies, to measure the impact of change
- Qualitative studies with inputs and data from mothers/grandmothers related to breastfeeding experience

# 'Workshop in Research Methodology' $8^{\text {th }}$ to13 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ August 2016 

Krishna Insitute of Medical Sciences Deemed University, Karad scheduled workshop in Research Methodology for Post Graduate Students from Faculty of Medicine, Nursing, Dental and Physiotherapy and also for Ph. D. Students as well as for interested faculty members.

Workshop was conducted as per the scheduled programme (Attached Time Table for the workshop) from 8th to 13th August 2016.

The 9th Certificate Course in Research Methodology was conducted for 6 full days. Every day irrespective of lunch break, lecture/discussion sessions were conducted for 6 hours. The total hours of lectures delivered/discussions in 6 days were $341 / 2$ hours.

Total 76 delegates from Medical, 12 from Dental, 12 from Physiotherapy, 14 from Nursing, \& 4 Ph. D. Students and 3 faculty members attended the workshop (Total 121).

Workshop began with inaugural programme. Dr. A. K. Pratinidhi madam our former Director of Research was Chief Guest. Dr. Sanjay Mehendale, Director National Institute \& Epidemiology (NIE), Dr. P. Ganeshkumar, Scientist C (NIE), Dr. Angeline Grace, Scientist C (NIRT), Chennai and Dr. P. M. Durgawale Prof. \& Head, Dept. of Community Medicine were also present. In Dr. Pratinidhi madams speech she stressed upon importance of research. In welcome address Dr. Mrs. Supriya S. Patil explained about the importance of this workshop as well as plan for the same. Subsequently topics covered were right from introduction to research, study designs, sampling, sample size, statistical tests, analysis plan and also overview of qualitative research method.

Writing concept paper topic was covered on $2^{\text {nd }}$ day and on same day concept paper template printouts were distributed to all delegates since then emphasis was given on concept paper writing. On $12^{\text {th }}$ August 2016 in afternoon session individually students worked on their own dissertation topics and which was followed by presentations by randomly selected students on $13^{\text {th }}$ August 2016 in morning session surprise MCQ Test - 30 Questions ( 30 marks) was conducted on $12^{\text {th }}$ August 2016. Total 92 students appeared for examination. Out of them 67 $(72.83 \%)$ students scored above $50 \%$. Top 10 were awarded with trophy at the time of valedictory programme (List is attached)

All the sessions were informative while maximum sessions were interactive. Apart from


NIE and NIRT faculty topics covered by faculty from other institutes and KIMSDU were also of good quality. Pre and Post test evaluation will be completed within 2 wks.

For the valedictory programme Dr Patwardhan, observer from Maharashtra Medical Council was present, who was present throughout the workshop. Maharashtra Medical Council has given 4 credit points for this workshop. Certificates will be given to delegates who have satisfactorily completed the workshop. It was declared that last date for submission of protocols will be $24^{\text {th }}$ August 2016.

Total expenses for the workshop were $1,10,893 /$. Detailed statement of expenses is attached herewith.

External Disaster: Outside the campus.
Minor- Incident involving small no. of causalities (less than 10)
Major- Incident involving large no of casualties (more than 10)
Disaster threat effecting the hospital or community (nearby fires, Earthquakes, railway accident, flooding, cyclones, explosions etc.

What is the Patient flow during internal/ external disaster?

1) Call received at control room / hospital board
2) Code alert system ( receiving center confirms the call and incident)
3) Code announced (Code Red DM) - Medical director only
4) Administration informed by incident commander( medical director)

As per disaster management patient shall be categorized as per their causalities
A) Red = First Priority, Patient shall be shifted to causality ICU
B) Yellow= Second priority , Patient shall be shifted to causality
C) Green = Third Priority, Patient shall be shifted to OPD
D) Black = Dead patient shifted to pharmacy passage.
